CONCEPT NOTE

"REVERSE MIGRATION: AN EFFORT TO REBLOOM THE VILLAGES IN THE WAKE OF THE PANDEMIC"

March 2020, started a new chapter in the lives of every Indian. The whole world at large was hit by the deadly novel coronavirus which was declared as a pandemic by WHO. Covid-19 outbreak led to a national lockdown in India. The lockdown which was put into effect by the government led to millions of migrants being stranded hundreds of miles away from their hometowns / villages.

As we are aware of the fact that a large number of population of the hilly state of Uttarakhand are migrants at various states of India, most of such migrants were stuck / stranded at different parts of India during the lockdown.

With the pandemic being deadly and dangerous in most parts of India, Uttarakhand was fortunately safer in comparison to the other states. Thus, post lockdown, huge number of migrants returned back to their respective native towns / villages, which led to reverse migration in the state of Uttarakhand. It was also reported that the aforementioned ghost villages were brought back to life as the migrants returned back to their respective home towns / villages.

Honourable Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi Ji had in his numerous conferences suggested and advised how to tackle the small-scale economy during the pandemic. One of the most commonly heard term was ATMANIRBHAR – Bharat (self-reliant India). In other words, the Honourable Prime Minister encouraged the people of India to tackle this hard phase by manufacturing / producing the goods on their own or start small scale businesses.

It is a fact that these migrants have returned back to their native places with a lot of experience in various fields and businesses. The Government of Uttarakhand having this at the back of their minds also announced a few policies to help the migrants who have returned in the wake of the pandemic. One such policy started was Uttarakhand Mukhyamantri Saur Swarogar Yojna 2021 with the aim to provide self-employment opportunities to small and marginal farmers and unemployed youth of the state.

Surprisingly, the migrants at large have not quite shown much interest to the policies announced by the government. In fact, a lot of them have desired to go back to the other states after the pandemic ends.

Uttarakhand has immense potential in terms of various industries including handloom, handicrafts, food processing, cultivation of herbs, dairy and poultry farming for rural sector and tourism. Migrants would show interest in starting their small ventures if the government provides interest free loans, heavy subsidies and free electricity for people to set up new venture like eco-tourism and micro-enterprises.

OBJECTIVES OF THE CONFERENCE

The main objectives to be covered in the conference include the following:

• To make the migrants aware of various business opportunities that they can set up through minimum available funds and to create a proper channel to help the migrants receive proper knowledge of the business and related schemes for its development.

- To create an application or a medium/forum where experienced entrepreneurs from different fields and businesses could educate and nurture the people / migrants who wish to undertake a business.
- To have a discussion session where migrants having various ideas and experiences could interact and probably start new business jointly.
- To create a platform to give job opportunities to the unskilled migrants probably in the new business started by the other experienced migrants.
- Lastly, the ideas, feedbacks and suggestions given by the target audiences to be looked into by the conference committee thoroughly and framing of the important / useful ideas into schemes and being submitted to the Rural Development and Migration Commission (RDMC), Government of Uttarakhand for the welfare of the reverse migrants.

GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

Title: The title of the chapter should be followed by Name(s), Designation, and Name of organization/University/Institution and e-mail address.

Originality: the manuscript should not be published or presented elsewhere and should not be submitted in more than one journal/book.

Font and font size: times new roman 12 and 16 for kruti dev font.

Abstract: the manuscript should include the abstract of 150-300 words it maximum 5 keywords.

Content: the manuscript should be divided into the following sections:

- (a). Introduction, (b). Review of literature, (c). Objectives Research, (d). Methodology,
- (e). Hypotheses or research questions, (f). Analysis and interpretation, (g). Conclusions and Recommendations, (h). References.

Tables and figures: they should be placed inside the text. Title of the tables and figures should appear before the table or figure. All tables and figures should have authentic reference.

Reference style: references should be listed at the end of the manuscript and numbered in the order they appear in the text. APA style of referencing should be used.
